D.	 Public Forum (Community members will be given a few minutes each to share their concerns, ideas, celebrations, etc.) Tiffany Kolodzieczyk and Jennifer Posern shared their excitement regarding CSISD purchasing the streaming rights to the 4th-grade growth and development videos. Parents will be able to access the videos at any time during a two-week window. Previously parents had to watch the video during school hours, when many parents were at work. Purchasing the streaming rights provides flexibility for parents so that they can decide whether or not to opt in for their child. Eric Posern asked if SHAC fully addressed air quality from the November meeting. Magan Smith shared that Kevin Starnes spoke with Facilities & Maintenance and testing had been completed and came back within normal

limits.

- Tiffany McFarland shared concerns regarding traffic safety at South Knoll Elementary School. She shared there is an intersection where cars block access for buses. Neo Jang asked who is responsible for school traffic, College Station ISD, or the City of College Station. Erin Ferris shared from past experiences at Rock Prairie Elementary School that the City of College Station is responsible for all traffic signs and regulations surrounding schools.
- Eric Posern asked if SHAC fully addressed advertisements students watch at school; particularly via YouTube. Magan Smith shared that Kevin Starnes spoke with Technology and there was currently no way to censor advertisements on YouTube. Julia Meyer asked if there was any guidance for teachers. Magan Smith shared all teachers must follow acceptable use policies, as stated in the CSISD Employee Handbook. Julia Meyer asked about guidance specifics in the employee handbook. Magan Smith agreed to share information from the CSISD Employee Handbook.
- Eric Posern asked how we address cell phones during PE and on campus. Megan Symank shared that secondary campus students bring their own devices for educational use and then there are different policies based on grade levels. Erin Ferris shared the history of cell phone policy recommendations from SHAC. Magan Smith agreed to share information regarding CSISD's cell phone use policy. Eric Posern asked if this is something we could look at again. Magan Smith shared that CSISD is working on increasing the number of technology devices available on campus for students to use. Darin Paine shared that this concern is also based on parent discretion, whether or not they allow students to bring a cell phone to school. Eric Posern questioned whether or not cell phone data would influence the school district's decision regarding cell phones. SHAC members agreed that this is the forum to review data. Erin Ferris shared a teacher's perspective regarding cell phone use on campus.
